Heifer Replacement Program.....Veril Nelson

Each year the DCLA presents up to two heifers to youth who are selected by a committee appointed by the board of DCLA. To be considered, students must complete an application and submit it to the extension office by: September 15th of the current year

Eligible students must be between 5th and 11th grade at time of application and can be 4-H or FFA members and they must have exhibited a livestock project at the Douglas County Fair prior to time of application. This program requires that the student have adequate facilities or a suitable location to keep the heifer and provide the feed for the animal.

Legislative Update Bill Hoyt

Oregon Legislature:

*HB 3427 PASSED Creates a tax on all Oregon businesses with taxable receipts over \$1 million. Minimum tax \$250 plus .49% tax on receipts over \$1M

*HB 2020 FAILED. Cap and Trade with fuel tax. Failed in the Senate after Republicans walked out.

Another version likely in the future.

*HB 2005 PASSED Paid Family Leave for businesses

*SB 1049 PASSED Public Pension revision (PERS)

*HB 3365 PASSED Establishes Livestock Districts

*SB 301 / HB 2067 PASSED Elk Damage compensation and resolution

*HB 2746 / 2442 FAILED Wolf Compensation re-visited

*HB 5029 HB 5050 PASSED Tide gates money for installation and repair

*HB 2007 PASSED Clean Diesel Bill

Phases out the use of trucks older than 1997 by 2023 & trucks older than 2007 by 2029 in Clackamas, Washington & Multnomah counties.

Spring Livestock Conference.... S. Hendy DVM

This event is held every Spring. It consists of educational presentations and information booths that are of interest to livestock producers. A meal is usually served at the event. This year's event was held on April 12th at the Winston Community Center.

Lamb Show & BBQ..... Denny Quinby

This event is held on the first Saturday in June. The Douglas County Lamb Show has a long history of being an exhibition of the products of the sheep. Today, the DCLA is the organizing body behind this event which includes the Junior Livestock Auction, Lamb barbecue, and other events.

Our fiscal year will end on September 30th and invoices for next year will soon be in the mail.

As of 9/9/19 we have 218 members. Nine of those members were granted free memberships. Most of those were due to 2018 Sponsorship donations. Purebred Breeders.....Lee Sandberg

An annual ultrasound clinic is held most years, usually in March. Live animal carcass ultrasound is used to estimate carcass retail yield and meat quality. The common traits estimated include ribeye area (REA), backfat (BF), rump fat (RF) & percent intramuscular fat (IMF). This allows better accuracy and data which can help improve herd performance.

Farm Service Agency

To sign up for any of the following programs call Cindy, Tyree or Phil at FSA. 541-673-6071
LFP.....Livestock Forage Program. D-3 extreme drought was declared in Douglas County in early February. Applications are still being accepted.
ELAP....Emergency Loss Assistance Program. This program helps to pay for additional feed as a result of grazing loss due to the February storm.
LIP....Livestock Indemnity Program. May Reimburse ranchers for death loss greater than normal losses as a direct result of the February storm.
ECP Emergency Conservation Program. Assists with costs of fencing and debris removal from storm damages. This program is closed. Get your mapping information in to Cindy. More information on funding should be available in early 2020.
