SHOW RULES and IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Covid Compliance

1. All State Mandated rules pertaining to Covid-19 restrictions will be enforced.
 2. This will require at the minimum that masks be worn by all in attendance when inside the arena, social distancing, and no more than 100 people inside the arena at one time.
 3. The show is only open to those directly involved with the showman entered. Spectators will not be allowed.
 4. **Cattle will not be allowed to be tied/bedded or fit in the arena. Only cattle in the current class will be allowed indoors.**
 5. Modifications to the show rules may be made at any time to maintain compliance.
 6. Anyone not following the above rules will be given one warning and then asked to leave the show grounds.
- 1) Posted show schedule is subject to change.
 - 2) Market steers must be made available for weigh-in during the scheduled weigh-in times on the day of the show. No steers will be re-weighed.
 - 3) Heifers must have been born between 5-1-19 and 12-31-20, inclusive. Registration may be requested.
 - 4) Market lambs/goats and ewe lambs/doelings must be made available for weigh-in during the scheduled weigh-in times on the day of the show. Classes will be determined by weights. No lambs/goats will be re-weighed.
 - 5) Lambs/goats will be shown out of the trailer. No stall area or pens will be provided.
 - 6) All lambs/goats exhibited must have a **Premises ID or Scrapie Ear Tag issued through the USDA Scrapie Eradication Program.** For additional information contact the USDA veterinary offices at 1-866-873-2824.
 - 7) **All lambs/goats will be inspected by a veterinarian for absence of Club Lamb Fungus/Staph and Sore Mouth prior to crossing the scale. No unsightly conditions, active or healed lesions of Club Lamb Fungus or Sore Mouth will be tolerated or permitted.**
 - 8) All lambs must be slick shorn before crossing the scales. **Maximum weight for market lambs is 160 pounds.**
 - 9) All ewe lambs/doelings will be broke by weight. Lambs may enter both breeding and market classes.
 - 10) **Douglas County class animals will show and be evaluated as part of the regular open show with a separate DC championship class comprised of the top two DC steers/market lambs in each open class.**
 - 11) Animals must be shown by the exhibitor, except that if the exhibitor has more than one animal in a class, another exhibitor may show the other animal in that class.
 - 12) Showmanship animals must be shown in a market or breeding class
 - 13) This is a *JUNIOR EXHIBITORS SHOW*. Exhibitors must be 21 years of age or younger as of January 1st, 2021.
 - 14) Exhibitors must control their animals in a show ring manner at all times.
 - 15) Entries must be entered on **showman.app by April 14th**. Late entries will be charged an additional \$20/head entered. **No late Showmanship entries will be accepted.**
 - 16) Exhibitors must show their own animal in Showmanship classes. Prizes will be awarded in four divisions, according to the age of the exhibitor: Peewees (3rd grade and under); Junior Division (4th-6th grade); Intermediate Division (7th-9th grade); Senior Division (10th grade– Age 21)
 - 17) All overnight camping including dry lot camping anywhere on fairgrounds property is required to pay camping fees.
 - 18) The show committee reserves the right to make any changes or exceptions necessary for the betterment of the show.
 - 19) All entries are accepted with the understanding that neither the show committee, the Douglas County Livestock Association, the sponsors, or the Douglas County Fairgrounds are not responsible for any loss or damage that may arise to livestock, persons, or property at the show. Each exhibitor is responsible for any loss or damage arising from any animal exhibited by him/her to another.
